



1992 Mid Atlantic VHF Conference

If you are planning to attend the 1992 Mid Atlantic VHF Conference, do yourself a favor and pre-register. The room rates are \$64.00 a night if you register before Sept. 18. After then, the price goes up \$10.00. We are offering a dollar off each meal and 2 bucks off the conference fee if you pre-register by Sept. 15. We must tell the Sheraton how many people will be attending 4 days before the event. Remember, if you enjoy ham radio fellowship like I do, you'll send in your form pronto.

The Propagation report 15 July to 13 August 1992 by Bill Murphy WORSJ, FN20JR

I have been traveling since the beginning of the period but know that there has been some good Tropo on 2 through 432 MHZ. I did spend two days listening to the Presides meteor shower. I base my opinions on listening to schedules of others and monitoring 144.200 MHz. The shower appears to have peaked on 11 Aug. 1992 between 19:15 and 19:50 GMT on the east coast. Unfortunately many people were knocked off the air due to severe thunderstorm activity in the area just as the shower peaked. I noted a good number of Blue whizzer's on 12 Aug around the 18:00 GMT time period with stations in the 4TH, 5TH and 9TH call area. Many stations working random's on 144.200 made five or more contacts during this period. I listened to the HF frequency 3.818 MHz and the interest in the shower appears to be increasing in area.

The Big Opening in August (so far) By: Dave, N3CX

Well, it was Friday evening on 21 Aug. What beautiful WX for August. The temp was already 55 deg at 2030 local time. I was setting on the back porch with the XYL talking over the days events. Earlier in the evening I had mentioned to Sylvia (my XYL) that this seemed like a night for tropo. Being married to an amateur for 25 years especially a VHF/UHF ham she knows what the word tropo is-HI. Well I said I was going to the shack to see how the bands are. She said CU tomorrow (the XYL knows what happens in the shack if things are good). I flipped the ON/OFF switch on my 432 amp to ON and called CQ towards the west -nothing. I called CQ again and KOBI/8 in EN72 comes back-WOW I said, sigs about 539. After that exchange, I called CQ again and WASEUU/EN82, next K8MD/EN82, W8UCI/EN82, W3QIZ/FN00 /20 over 9. I moved the antennas around and heard the boys in WNY talking to K3SIW/9. I broke in and told them to tell the boys out west to turn their antennas East. I moved down to 432.097 and called CQ again -there was a signal in there and it came out of the noise WORAP/EN42/Iowa, sigs were up to 559, next QSO K3SIW/9/EN42/Ill. Now I was jumping around calling on the 222 machine trying to get the Rats on, but it was late and a Friday. I was almost 2400 and I hit the sack when the tropo went away. I got up early Saturday morning (8/22) and tried to work WASEUU again, I had a set up a sked -but nothing. Paul, WASNZL, called me and said he had talked with WASEUU on 432.1 about 0700 and sigs were really down, no path for me this morning. Saturday night was hot starting about 2030 local time and K4CAW called me. He's in FM06 and was 25/9 pounding in. We went right to 1296 and he was just as strong on 23 cm. Went back to 432 and called -WD4KPD/FN15 came back, we went to 222 also. Not everyone has packet radio to check the band out on condx's. Sunday morning o (8/23) was jumping. I worked N4EVV/FM04, WB4TQD/FM05, WR3I/4/FM06, WB4YWI/EM95 and I got called by WA4ZIA/EM95 - he was pounding in almost pinning the meter at times. We worked from 432 up thru 3456MHz- "unbeleiveable". Signals on 3456 were 459- I was really excited! Sunday evening I worked K4CAW on 432 and WA3AXV and myself had a round table with Al on 1296. K2UOP/FM09 showed up and gave a few Rats a new one on 1296, from Tom's new QTH in the mts of WVA. WD4JQV/EM94-SC was in there on 432 and I also worked him on 1296. After he called W3ZZ with no luck, he called me - what excitement. On the Monday night net (8/24) things were still in there with KM4ID/EM93. At this writing, I hope this is a sign of the fall season.

MICROWAVE UPDATE '92

Update is the premier because of the location of Rochester and its excellent airline connections, this year's conference may well turn out to be the largest ever held. In addition to the "regulars" who have attended past Updates, we expect a good draw from the large contingent of microwavers present in the Northeast. We are planning a tour of the local surplus outlets on Thursday, october 15 for those who arrive early. Technical presentations will occupy both Friday and Saturday. Not to break Make plans now to attend Microwave Update '92, which will be held October 16-18, 1992 at the Holiday Inn Holidome in Rochester, New York. The Rochester VHF Group is proud to have with tradition, we will conduct Noise Figure measurements on Friday night, along with a poster session and indoor flea market. The activities will officially end Saturday night with a fine banguet, to be held at the Holidome. Microwave opportunity to sponsor this year's conference.
