

The Propagation Report for 5/14/92 to 6/17/92

The six meter band has been open due to E skip for considerable periods of time over the past month. On May, 25 the band opened at 1800 GMT with EM19, EM37, EM48, EN10, EM09, EM18, EN31, EN14, EM77 and EM45 worked between 1900 and 0045 in FN20. In addition a brief double hop contact occurred with WA6BYA in CM87. As the month progressed six was open almost every day. This past weekend, the VHF QSO PARTY was run and band conditions were excellent with the band opening on 13 June. This opening was sporadic E with some double hop to the Pacific NW. W3CCX located in FN21 reported working 186 grids on six and 55 on the two meter band in the contest. Conditions were reported to be good on all the microwave bands. The only complaint was that activity was low. One of the highlights of the contest was a narrow band 10GHZ SSB contact between W3CCX and K2UYH over a partially obstructed path. This was witnessed by a number of Pack Rats who I hope will be putting 10 GHZ on the air soon from there home QTH's. Al is on from his home location using waveguide to his dish.

Andrew Coaxial Cable Information

Have you ever wandered thru a hamfest and spotted some neat looking coax and were unsure of what it was? It says Andrew and you know that this is good but how good is it? Worth the \$1.00 a foot? Here's a quick guide to some of the more common Andrew coax that you may come across, attenuation and common connectors to look for. It's frequently the connector part that's tough to find -especially at a reasonable price. As a reference, Belden 9913 is shown. Note that it runs around \$0.60 per foot.




MODIFICATIONS FOR THE SHF SYSTEMS 540 MHz LO

Several people have experienced local oscillator instability problems on the SHF Systems 3456 transverter board when driven by the SHF 540 MHz LO. The 540 MHz LO generates +16 dBm (40 mW) by using an MAV-11 MMIC at its output. This LO level may be insufficient to properly drive the 3456 multiplier chain, resulting in oscillations in the MAR-08 MMIC's. This instability may be eliminated by increasing the 540 MHz LO level. The LO output may be easily increased to greater than 100 mW by substituting a Thom son TRF-559 bipolar transistor for the MAV-11 on the 540 LO board.

Remove the MAV-11 and enlarge the MMIC mounting hole to allow the TRF-559 to sit in the hole flush with the PC board. Solder the emitter leads to the adjacent ground pads and place an additional "wire-thru" ground close to the transistor. Use an ATC "B" or similar capacitor for the RF bypass soldered upright on the adjacent ground. A 20K 1/4 watt resistor is soldered from the top of the RF bypass to the transistor base lead.






Attenuation Curves based on: VSWR 1.0 Ambient Temperature 24°C (75°F) Atmospheric Pressure, dry air
