

THE PREZ SEZ

Since last month I recuperated enough to have made my way to the Mecca of all hamfests Dayton. The Pack Rats were well represented. This year I had no particular plan to find any special parts so I mingled. I ran into a number of VHF and microwave people that I have known for a number of years and met some new ones for the first time. The following is some of the information I picked up. Each year a group of VHF/Microwave folks get together for dinner on Friday night. I was asked why we did not attend. My answer was we did not know about it or we would have. Years ago I can remember a similar get together that was arranged by W8KPY which was attended by the late Jim Fisk then editor of Ham Radio magazine and others. In those days 20 or so people attended. From What I hear this year is that they had 100 which may be their limit. I was told that a HF net takes place on Monday night for VHF information and schedules. I explained that the Pack Rats run nets on Monday evening and this preoccupies us. I was asked what happened to the 222 net now that WC2K is off the air. My answer was that WB2YEH has taken over the net.

I had a long talk with Bill Tynan, W3XO, who shares the concerns that a lot of us have that our beloved VHF/Microwave bands are under risks of being lost. He has asked me to distribute cumulative contest forms to all in the club who want them. The intent is to get people on the air, more on this later.

We must keep our communications channels open and listen to what they have to say with an open mind. This is in the best interest of all of us and may help save the bands.

The Propagation Report for 4/15/92 to 5/13/92 by Bill Murphy, WORSJ

At long last we are beginning to see some activity. On the weekend of May 9th and 10th a fairly good aurora took place. At 1930 UTC on 10 May, I noticed aurora on 6 meters. It was weak but gradually strengthened. I was hearing VE3, and the 8th and 9th call areas. K3EOD reported that he worked the following stations, W1AJR, N8CCC and K1GAO. It is interesting to note that an Auroral E session developed as the aurora died. The clarity of the E was excellent on six with no trace of distortion. I did not notice any trace of the aurora E on two meters. Two had plenty of aurora earlier however. On 12 May, there was E skip to NOLL and KOFF at 2343 UTC. The 6 meter band remained open for about 3 hours to the 5th and 0 call areas. The 1296 MHz sprint had a good turn-out in the NE with a new station active in FMO7.

VHF/UHF CENTURY CLUB

Have you thought about gathering up your QSL cards and submitting them for a VHF/UHF Century Club Certificate? Are you unsure of what the rules are and don't look forward to the hastle and worry of mailing them to the ARRL? Well, part of this problem is easily solves since I am an official checker of logs and can certify your cards without you having to send them to the league. I have the forms and rules available and can check your cards if you can get them to me. Basically, you must be a member of the ARRL and have QSL cards confirming your contacts. Contacts must be direct (not thorough a repeater) and must have occurred after Jan. 1, 1983.

Initial requirements for each band are as follows:

50 and 144 MHz: 100 grid squares 222 and 432 MHz: 50 grid squares 902 and 1296 MHz: 25 grid squares

2304 MHz: 10 grid squares 3.4 GHz and up: 5 grid squares

THE STRENGTH OF MASTS By Dick Comly, N3AOG

Thinking of upgrading your tower, adding more antennas, or possibly bigger ones? Some considerations of mast size will or should come to play. Some years ago a fellow "Rat" and myself were designing a large array for his station and I gave this problem some thought. I did some number crunching and the following table is the result. All of the figures given represent the maximum load. The load distance is the distance from the last support of the mast (thrust bearing, etc.) to the top of the mast or the location of the antennas. The values given are for T6061 aluminum.


