

PROPAGATION REPORT By Paul Drexler, WB3JYO

Propagation during the first week of June was enough to wet the appetite of any VHFer, and many had predicted super conditions for the June contest weekend. On the evening of June 1st, 50 MHz opened to New Foundland as reported by Pack Pat N3EXA. Then, during the evening as temperatures dropped from the 80+ degree mark, a tropo duct formed over most of the East Coast - most notable 144 MHz contact was KV4P in FM27 with an S9+30 dB signal into the Philadelphia area. On the following day, June 2, a solar flare produced Aurora propagation from our area to all of New England and grids FM25, EM79, and EN73 from 2200 to 2300z. Again on the 4th at 2030z a short duration Aurora occurred with the best DX being VEIBVL (FN95) on 144 MHz. On the 5th, a MAJOR solar storm occurred during the morning which brought a healthy 3-hour period of Aurora on 6 and 2 meters beginning around 2200z with strong signals from stations in FN54, EN62, and EN72.

Just days before the June 8-9 contest weekend, a large high pressure system was building over most of eastern U.S., which was expected to bring tropo enhancement during the contest, along with a good chance of Aurora as a result of even more solar events. As predictions go however, Mother Nature had something different in store. Although the weather was excellent throughout the weekend for the Pack Rat expedition to Camelback Mountain, the strong high pressure began to deteriorate, dashing hopes of big tropo. Instead, conditions were about normal for most of the weekend with a few exceptions. The W3CCX 50 MHz team experienced sporadic Aurora openings throughout the entire weekend, each lasting from 5 to 30 minutes maximum. From their mountaintop perch the 6 meter crew also worked sporadic E propagation on and off throughout the contest. Propagation on 2 meters wasn't as exciting - only 3 Aurora QSO's were made during the weekend and the tropo enhancement was nil. Probably the best 144 MHz contacts were to Florida early Saturday evening with a short period of E skip. The 220/222 and 432 MHz teams report similar conditions minus the E skip of course. Best DX for those bands occurred early Sunday morning. At the microwave truck, W3CCX operators had more of the same although they managed two notable contacts - N2WK (FN13) on 3456 MHz and W2SZ/l (FN32) on 5760 MHz.

We're smack in the middle of E-skip season here in North America. Keep a watch for DX on 6 and 2. It's also tropo season, so be aware of large, stagnant high pressure systems which produce great conditions on all VHF/UHF bands. The sun is still quite active with some magnificent flares continuing to occur. These produce Aurora. It's the VHFers time of the year!


This new location will provide conference attendees with improved comfort and convenience. The Pack Rats are looking forward to hosting VHF Conference 1991!!


