ARRL SUMMARY OF DOCKET 87-14 COMMENTS: (from ARRL LETTER dated June 2, 1987)

The following is a summary filed by ARRL in its comments to the Commission in Docket 87-14. They provide an excellent overview of past FCC actions regarding the band and why the FCC proposal not only will cause hardship to present users, but will impede the development of future amateur technology on other bands.

"Since 1973, when amateurs occupied 220-225 MHz on a secondary basis, the band has been the target of a vast array of proposals to displace amateur operation there in favor of other uses ... the constant threat of disen-franchisement is a powerful disincentive to amateur interest in the band.

Notwithstanding, amateur occupancy of the band increased at a remarkable pace, especially after 1974 when saturation of the 144-148 MHz band necessitated installation of amateur repeaters on amateur bands above those frequencies. The US proposed an amateur allocation at 220-225 MHz going into the 1979 World Administrative Radio Conference. The 1981 NTIA Study of the 216-225 MHz band concluded that amateurs were the heaviest users of the 220-225 MHz band, and that development of the band should be by sharing between amateurs and non-critical government fixed and mobile users. DOCKET 87-14 (continued from page 4)

The three Petitions on which the instant Notice was based did not seek specifically to displace amateurs. In fact, the LAOAD Petition specifically sought to avoid any use of the 220 MHz band. The Notice in this proceeding is thus faulty in its premises. If land mobile needs any additional spectrum at all, given the recent 800 MHz allocations and the pending UHF-TV/land mobile sharing docket, a narrowband allocation should be established elsewhere, within the existing allocation at 30-50 or 150 MHz, or in the 216-220 MHz segment.

The Amateur Radio Service has a variety of critical operations at 220-222 MHz, including fixed, auxiliary and control links for repeaters, beacons, weak-signal propagation, research and expermentation, and most recently, an increasing number of high-speed data links for amateur packet operation. These links must be situated at 220-222 MHz due to the bandwidth and path lengths required, and the heavy loading of the 222-225 MHz segment. The commission's proposal stands to seriously harm the development of existing operations, including repeater operations on other bands, and a new emergency communications technology with remarkable potential. For these and other reasons, the Notice proposal should not be adopted; amateurs should have continued access to the entire 220-225 MHz band."




