PROPAGATION REPORT By Paul Drexler, WB3JY0

Once again this past month's activity has proven noteworthy, Activity seems to be slowly increasing as the cooler weather sets in. Get that antenna work done before your fingers sticl to the tower! The big news to report occurred on the 16th and 17th of Oct. On the 16th, at 2000 hrs local time, K3QIF was S9+20 on 2 mtrs., worked by myself, W2EIF and W3HFY. Although Rusty is usually strong the band seemed to be in good shape. No one else however, was worked Friday evening.

Early Saturday morning however, things were different. Several CQ's to the SW netted WA3MMP (FM17) on 144 and 432, K4QKR (FM06) on 144 and 432, and several others to the south. Signals were strong on both 144 and 432 although no contacts were to be found for 220 or 1296. After working my fill of contacts to the FM17/FM06 area single CQ on 144,200 was answered by WD4AFY (EM92) in Savannah, GA! Andy was S4 to S5 for over a half hour; a number of the FN20 and New England boys were able to make the contact. WA4VCC (EM84) and K3HJE (EM96) were also worked on 144 with good signals. A two way was completed with K3HJE on 432 but WA4VCC wasn't heard. Two meters had its share of excitement until shortly before noon on the 17th.

On October 20th at 1930 hrs Mike, N3BBI heard several Ø's on six although 2 ways were not completed. Marck, WB2JHG reports enhancement on the higher bands on the morning of Oct. 24th. Mark reported the "CX 903 beacon to be S9+20 (usually strong for his QTH) but no activity was heard. However, on Friday evening the 20th, N3CX worked WB3CZG on 903 - over a 100 mi path - w/good signals. "CZG was running 15 watts to an 8' TVRO dish just 8' off the ground! On the 3rd of Nov. Dave again made the contact on both 903 and 2304. WB3CZG was 539 running 1 watt to the same dish. On the 17th of Nov. enhancement was observed on all of the evening nets. K1PXE was several S-units stronger than usual on 432. Pete even reported W3CL as being 'louder than ever.'

A REPORT BY KS2T

I have some news from the U.K. concerning 6 meter propagation they've had. The station on from Madeira is CT3DK. There are at least 5 stations on 6 meters from Malta, 9H1BT, CG, EL, FL and GB. NOTE: that 2nd one is CG as in Coast Guard. The C and G look quite the same on this daisy wheel.

On Oct. 8th, A22KZ (Botswana) at 1720 UTC, was heard on 50.110 SSB in southern England. At this same time southwest England was hearing Malta and cyprus.

On Oct. 17th at 1040 UTC, G6XHQ (I091UL) heard ZS3E (Namibia) for $1\ 1/2$ minutes on 50.110 SSB. G6XHQ had the impression that ZS3E was talking with someone in the Mediterranean area. Trans-equatorial and Es combination of propagation is supported here.

Oct. 22nd at 1535 UTC, G2ADR (1093KX) heard A22KZ on 50.110 CW, 549. G2ADR couldn't get his 6 meter transmitter going but fortunately a QSO was made on 28.885 with A22KZ and then at 1547 UTC a 2-way QSO on 50.110, G2ADR received a 519 from A22KZ and gave him a 539. G2ADR was using 9 watts and a dipole, A22KZ was using a IC551D and 4 elements!

At 1638 UTC, G4HBA (1093ES) worked A22KZ and gave a 539 and G4HBA got a 529. G2ADR made another QSO with A22KZ at 1644-1648 UTC. G4HBA uses 15 watts and 3 elements.

At 1650 UTC, GM4DGT (1086CD) worked A22KZ giving him 539 and GM4DGT got a 519.

At 1652 UTC, GlAWP had a CW QSO with A22KZ.

At 1555 UTC, G4GAI (1083VP) worked A22KZ giving a 539 and getting a 419 report. G4GAI uses 10 watts and 3 elements.

At 1657 UTC, G3CCH worked A22KZ receiving 529 and giving a 579 signal report. A22KZ was heard on and off up till 1722 UTC.


A22KZ had 15 days of propagation to Malta and SV1DH. 9HIBT and A22KZ had nightly contacts peaking between 1630-1730 UTC from October 8-13th. A22KZ is in grid KG19RX.

Back to the 17th, ZS3E worked 9H1BT and CT4KQ at 1450 UTC. Harry, the above info was sent to me by Dave, G4GLT. It was in some sort of 'newsletter' or 'bulletin' of some kind. There was no indication of who wrote this 'report' or who put it out. I'm writing to G4GLT to find out and ask if I can receive furure reports from him or whomever. I think in October's Cheese Bits you have me down for working 50 countries on 6 mtrs, if you want you can change that to 52 countries worked and 51 confirmed, I'm waiting for GM3ZBE.




