NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS By Lyn, W3NSI

- 1. GAASFET PREAMPS: Hamtronics (Hilton, N.Y.) has introduced a line of GassFET preamps, both kit and wired, for 144,220, and 432 Mhz. The LNW series units are on open PC boards for mounting in your own case or inside the transceiver. Price for these very small preamps is Kit \$19 and Wired \$38. The LNS series in line preamps feature automatic switching for transmitter power up to 25 watts. LNS could be installed in the line between the exciter and PA or at the antenna if 25 watts or less is used. Tower mounting hardware is included. Price Kit \$68 Wired \$98 (65-D Moul Road 14468)
- 2. SMALL ALUMINUM TOWERS: Alinco Electronics has four size of towers for use with oscar antennas or small HF beams for roof mounting. Sizes range from 3 1/2 to 6 1/2 feet high and all have a rotor mounting shelf. Other features are all bolted construction, four legs for ease of mounting on peak roofs, and provision for a top mounted thrust bearing. Prices range from \$67 to \$107. P.O. Box 70007 Reno NV 89570
- 3. ICOM AUTOMATIC ANTENNA SYSTEM AH-2: The AH-2 was designed for use with the IC 735 HF Transceiver. The system comes with a 107" stainless steel whip and mount, a control box for use at the T/R, cables for interconnections, and tuner unit which is mounted in a plastic box that can be placed in the car trunk or on an apartment balcony. The unit may be purchased without the whip and mount for those who wish to feed a random wire at a base location or have a whip mounted on the car. The unit will work all bands 10-80 and with an extension on the whip or with a wire 38' long will also operate on 160 meters. Average tuning time is 2-4 seconds and can tune from 10 to 80 in six seconds. The case measures about 9" by 14" and there is a lot of "stuff" inside there. It almost looks like another T/R. List Price \$550.

DELAWARE VALLEY COUNCIL OF RADIO CLUBS

The first meeting of the Council was called by Edith, W3AAU, in the hamshack at the Naval Depot on Oxford and Martins Mill Road at 8:00 pm on January 16, 1986. Twelve hams attended this meeting, representing more than twelve clubs, because most hams belong to more than one club.

The Council Can assist in the coordination of the effort of member clubs for the following: VEC Exam Scheduling; Newsletter coordination; Service projects --- non-emergency, such as marathons; Speakers Bureau; Program Pool; Exchange of Club Activities; Amateur Radio Demonstrations; Legal Problems; Public Relations.

It was agreed that organization of the Council should proceed along the following lines:

The objective of the Council is to lend such aid as possible in developing the Amateur Radio Clubs in the Delaware Valley (including Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware) along progressive lines; and to promote friendly relations and cooperation among the Clubs in the area; to take general interest in all matters and problems affecting or involving Amateur Radio; and take such action as may be deemed appropriate.

The Council shall be made up of representatives of each club that wishes to join. Each Club shall appoint a delegate and an alternate. Each Club will have one vote. A quorum of twenty-five percent of the member Clubs is required and a majority of voting members present will prevail.

Frequency of meetings will be determined later.

An organization meeting is to be called for March 2, 1986 at 4 P.M. at the Naval Depot Cafeteria to elect officers and draw up Operating Guidelines.

AMATEUR RADIO ADVANCED CLASS LICENSE COURSE TO BE OFFERED AT PENNRIDGE EVENING SCHOOL

A course leading to the Advanced Class Amateur (Ham) Radio License will be offered in the Spring 1986 session of the Pennridge Area Evening School. The ten-week course will be offered on Monday evenings, beginning March 3.

Students in this course should already hold the Technician or General Class Amateur Radio License, and be able to copy International Morse Code. The code speed requirement for this Advanced Class License is 13 words per minute.

The instructor for the course is Robert Garland, a Telford resident lincensed as a Ham Radio Operator since 1963. Mr. Garland previously taught Ham Radio classes at Souderton Evening School, and at the U.S. Coast Guard Training Center in New York City.

The text for the course will be the Amateur Radio Advanced Class License Manual published by the American Radio Relay League. The approximate cost of the text is \$5.00. No code practice will be offered as part of the classroom instruction. However, students will be assisted in obtaining code practice material for use outside of class.
