

NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS By Lyn, W3NSI

- 1. <u>KENWOOD 220 RIG</u>: A letter from Craig Martin KR6T Customer Service Manager at Kenwood indicates that a 220 Mhz mobile rig matching the 2M TM2530 will be available soon. FM only, no price at this time.
- 2. NRD 525 RECEIVER: Japan Radio Co. will soon release the new NRD 525 receiver, which like the 505 and 515, will be general coverage and digital readout. No price info. yet.
- 3. TEN TEC RX325 RECEIVER: Production will begin soon on the new general coverage Ten Tec 325 receiver. A 9 digit readout is featured as well as keyboard entry of frequency, also regular variable tuning. Twenty five memories will be available which will store frequency, mode and band. Other features, are built in amplified whip antenna or external antenna, tuning knob lock out, noise blanker, clock timer, all in a very compact 9x9x3 cabinet. Price about \$500
- 4. <u>KENWOOD TS 440S</u>: The new Kenwood 440 does not replace the 430. The 440 covers the same range as the 430 with the same power, but with some extra features. To start with, all modes are built in, including FM & FSK (200 watts in), optional built in automatic antenna tuner, keyboard entry of frequency, computer interface port, and 100 memories. Price about \$1,000 list.

ARRL BULLETIN NR 19 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS NEWINGTON CT MARCH 14, 1986 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS: UHF packet radio got a big boost today. At ARRL request, the FCC suspended parts of its rules to permit third party traffic by packet stations under automatic control. Several conditions are attached to the waiver, provisions of Sec. 97.80 B and 97.110 B 4, which were both to be added to the rules March 14, are waived to permit amateur stations retransmitting digital packet radio communications on 50 Mhz and higher bands using AX.25 or compatible protocol to be operated under automatic control while retransmitting third party traffic. This waiver applies only to the retransmission of third party traffic originated at another amateur station which is under local or remote control. When an amateur station is operated under automatic control, devices must be installed and procedures must be implemented which will ensure compliance with the rules when the control operator is not present at the control point of the amateur station. This waiver will remain in effect until the commission takes final action on the petitions for reconsideration filed in PR Docket 85 105. Amateur packet operators must be alert to the increased dependency upon them for monitoring during the period of this waiver. They should immediately make known to the responsible control operator of an automatic packet station any misuse of his station so the licensee can take corrective action. In summary, UHF packet radio may continue under automatic control.

N3AHI reports that the K3MXK group plans to install beacons from 432 thru 10 Ghz at their 4777 ft. contest site in Southwest North Carolina. More details will follow.

Al Whiting, K3BRS of Lanham, Md. asks that we be on the look-out for him during the upcoming Sprints. He will be running a gallon on six and two; 100 watts on 432 but only 3 to 10 watts on 1296. Al sent along a number of complete indexs of all volumes from 1970 to 1982 of VHF communications for distribution at our last meeting. Emil Pocock, W3EP of Athens, Ga. is revising the VHF propagation section of the ARRL 1987 Handbook at the present time. He also is going to study in detail VHF and UHF auroral propagation conditions during the great aurora on February 8th and 9th, 1986. He needs accurate reports of contacts made on all bands; 50 Mhz through 1296 Mhz. He says the following:

"Would you be willing to make copies of your logs during this aurora period? I need date-time, station, grid-square, and band for all contacts you made on 50 Mhz and higher, though I plan to focus on 144 Mhz and 432 Mhz.

I would be most interested to read of any 1296 Mhz aurora contacts, since none have ever been reported. I would be interested in any other comments and observations you have, and would also find it useful to know exactly how you learned an aurora session was in progress and when (what time) you first and last heard it.

I plan to write a full report on the aurora, which I would be happy to send to you in exchange for your logs. It may take me some time, but I hope you will find it worth the wait.

We did


