# NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS By Lyn, W3NSI

- 1. KENWOOD 2 M TR 751D: This new multi-mode 2 M rig is now being sold in Japan and is expected to go on sale here in the U.S. It may be a replacement for the 9130.
- 2. TOKYO HY-POWER LABS 220 AMPLIFIERS: Two new units are now available from this company. The HL22V boosts a 3 watt signal from an HT to 20 watts, FM only. A built in pre-amp using a GasFET can be switched in when needed on receive. Price \$100. The HL 102V has an output of 90 watts when driven by either 10 or 25 watts input. This is an all mode amp and also has a built in receive preamp. Price \$260.
- 3. VEHICLE EQUIPMENT MOUNT: The IIX Equipment LTD Co. of Oak Lawn III. (60454) has two mount systems of interest to hams having Vans, RVs, and Vehicles with flat floors in front. Up to four rigs can be mounted on either of two stands. The #10013 will allow radios up to 13" width to be mounted. The #1009 is used for widths up to 9". Both units mount to a flat floor using the plate and column supplied. The mount swivels and can be adjusted for height. VHF/UHF and ABOVE, Feb. 1986. KD5RO reviews the ICOM IC-1291A 1.2 Ghz transceiver. WA8NLC/4 describes a W6FO style 2304 Mhz GaAs FET preamp. With a NE673 it has 15 dB gain and a NF of 0.74 dB. W1JR describes a 28 and 31 element high gain long yagis for 432 Mhz. VHF COMMUNICATIONS Vol. 17, Autumn 1985. DL6XE describes helical antennas for 432 Mhz. DF7KB writes on noise matching antenna preamplifiers. Part 4 of a series on phase lock amplifiers by DK1OF describes carrier noise sidebands. DB1NV gives complete construction details on a 10.368 Mhz crystal controlled source.

# Modifications to the Pack Rat 2 Meter Transverter

# by Dave Mascaro, WA3JUF

Many of us built the Pack Rat 2 meter transverter in 1979-80. It had a good design and was easy to build. Although I used mine for a while, I could never get the transmit section tamed down. It sat unused until the Jan. 1986 contest when I decided to use it for the IF for my other transverters.

Symtoms: The driver amp (Q3) was unstable and ran hot. The final amp was unstable due to the preceding stage and was linear only up to 3-4 watts output. The final would run away thermally, also. Replacing the devices yielded the same results. A modern device that will run very linear at the 10 watt level is needed.

If you have similar problems, try these modifications. I now use mine on 2 meters, in addition to driving the 220, 1296, and 2304 transverters. The 903 MHz. transverter will be added to the system soon.

- 1. Lift the emitter of Q3 and add a 15 ohm resistor and a 1000 pf chip cap similar to R13, C8.
- 2. Check the idling current of Q3 and adjust the value of R16 for Icq of 20 ma.
  - 3. Replace C8, C12, and C21 with 1000 pf chip caps.
- 4. Replace the VK-200 choke on the collector of Q3 with 7 turns of #18 enamel wound on a 270 ohm 1/2 watt resistor.
- 5. Replace the 2N6081 final transistor with a Thomson SD1274 and set bias for lcg of 30-40 ma.
  - 6. Rebuild the final amplifier as follows:
    - a. Move C14 to the base of Q4.
    - b. Add a 47 pf UNELCO in parallel with C14.
    - c. Change L14 to 4 turns #16 enamel, 1/4" I.D.
    - d. Change C18 to Arco 421
    - e. Else the same

Tune up requires a Spectrum Analyzer, although adjusting mine for maximum output got me fairly close. Power output at the 1 dB compression point is 10-12 watts. Unwanted signals were down 30 dB in my unit.

Adding a high dynamic range RX converter is the next mod I plan to make.

All Class A license holders in the U.K. have 24 hour use of 50 - 50.5 MHz limited to what boils down to an ERP of 100 watts P.E.P. There is also 32 permits issued to Norway stations to be on when TV stations are off. They are allowed 25 watts but not sure if that means output or ERP. Also, from Ireland there are 20 permits issued for 6 meter operation during 'non-peak' TV time. Another addition to 6 meters on a 24 hour basis is CT1WW, grid IN61GE. According to SIX NEWS from the U.K. 6 METRE GROUP newsletter, CT1WW has no power restrictions, but RADCOM reports that he is running 3 watts. There should also be a beacon on from Malta soon (9HØMRL in grid JM65FV) frequency and antenna is not known; possibly 25 watts output but no talk of 6 meter activity, just a beacon. There may also be a 4th U.K. beacon on from SW England (Cornwall), GB3CTC, nothing solid yet.

Talked with Bernie/VE1UT - FN63XV - in Nova Scotia on 432 for over an hour on 31 March; caught him again on 2 April as did many others. Heard that N2CJP, FM16, in NC filled 5 log pages during the April 2nd opening on 432!

Can hardly wait for E skip to get going again, especially on 6 meters.

# RACKET? PACKET

Have you been trying to chat or make a few points in the test on simplex around 145.0MHz and heard the world's weirdest noises? Fingernails on the blackboard? A dyseptic moose? A Bronx cheer contest? If you supposed it was a leaky cable TV system or some other occult intrusion into Amateur spectrum, well, it isn't. What it is, is packet radio. Each blatz is a packet of information, surrounded by all sorts of organizational voodoo that permits error-free communication. Although it sounds awful to human ears, your computer would find it absolutely musical. But one thing packet can't tolerate is splatter from nearby voice operators. RTTY will survive hits. Packet won't. It's perfection or zilch. Customerly in the northeast, packet runs on 145.01, 145.03, 145.05, 145.07, and 145.09 MHz, FM simplex. The VHF contest rules don't advise staying clear of that area, unfortunately, so some interference situations have arisen without any malice on anyone's part. The ARRL Board of Directors has sent the question of recommended operating frequencies for VHF and HF packet to committees (see Minute 45 in March QST, page 63). Until a revision of the band plan is published, however, we'll have to depend on courtesy. Development in Amateur Radio sometimes means that we are obliged to change our operating habits. In any case, we're trying to keep the process friendly.

STRANGE BUT TRUE (from RADCOM) The following true story was told to a member of head-quarters staff visiting a well-known retailer in the south of England. A not-so-newly licensed amateur purchased a 144 MHz Yagi antenna to replace a chimney-mounted colinear used for local fm operation: a few days later he returned to the dealer demanding his money back, saying that the Yagi was a far worse performer than the colinear. The dealer was rather surprised and asked the amateur how he had installed it. It then emerged that the customer thought that "vertical polarization" meant mounting the antenna with its boom vertical and the array pointing directly upwards.

# ATLANTIC DIVISION CABINET MEETING

A meeting of ARRL section and division leaders, appointees, and elected officers met at the George Washington Motor Lodge in Plymouth Meeting, Pa. on April 19-20, 1986. The meeting was hosted by Hugh Turnbull, W3ABC with co-host Kay Craige, KC3LM, assistant section manager, E.Pa.

Section managers from MD-DC, Delaware, W. New York, and W. Pa. presented comprehensive reports, Mt. Airy VHF Radio Club (Pack-Rats) representatives were W2HX, BB Wentzel, W3CL, Harry Stein (assistant directors) and W2AXU, John Power, W2AXU was there by invitation to discuss the Winslow, Ewing and Tabernacle, New Jersey local ordanances affecting amateur radio operation.

Other important subjects discussed were the status of repeater coordination and operation with reports from TPARC representatives; the League and FCC on the issuance of special call signs; the work of the VE program and the status of the amateur auxilliary/00 system.

Hugh Turnbull discussed the Electronic Privacy Act under way in congress. Public service events were reported and a fifteen minute slide presentation by Bob Josuweit, WA3PZO, the E.Pa. EO, on last Novembers National Disaster Medical System Drill in the Philadelphia area. This was the same presentation he gave to the Pentagon this past February.

State government liason was discussed as well as packet radio and its effect on NTS. Problems relating to League operations were touched on. It was a most interesting and instructive meeting.
