

NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS By Lyn, W3NSI

- 1. HF KW AMPLIFIER: Tokyo Hy-power Labs have introduced the HL-1K/A amplifier covering all ham bands from 160 to 15 meters. A pair of 7094 ceramic tubes produce an output of 600 watts. Vernier tuning knobs are used on the plate and load controls. Other features include built in P.S. and a very compact double shielded cabinet.
- 2. MICROLOOP ANTENNAS: The Advanced Design Networks Co. is advertising a line of small loop antennas for all HF bands from 10 to 40 meters. The ten meter unit measures 27 inches across, while the largest, 40 meters is 108 inches. Antennas may be mounted vertically or horizontally. Bandwidth as expected is the penalty for the reduction in size. On ten meters for a limit of 1.5 SWR the bandwidth is 46 Khz while the worst figure is for 30 meters at 11 Khz. Antennas are supplied with hardware and should be mounted on non-metalic poles. Price 10-20 meter versions \$83.50. 30 and 40 meter units \$93.50.
- 3. SINADAPTOR: The Sinadaptor is designed to work with a VOM or AC voltmeter to measure SINAD. Such measurement capability allows the experimenter to tune receivers, preamps, cavities, etc. for optimum sensitivity. A range of 0-18 DB is available with meters reading 2.5 VAC. VHF REPORT

by Jay Miller, KS2T

Dave, N3CX has a beacon on 903.075 MHz. This will be a good signal source for anyone in the Philly area to tweak-up their home-brew converters as well as to follow propagation on that new band. The antenna is horizontal omni-directional.

50 MHz on up was quiet in earlyJune but kicked into gear on the 10th & 11th with a strong opening from the caribbean to the west coast.N4HSM & W6JKV were supplying St. Vincent Is., also they were worked during the QSO Party as well as a few other Caribbean Islands. Also on the 10th, Ron, KB3QM worked on 2 meters KP4EOR & EKG then into the southern states over to Mississippi. Not wanting to be outdone; 432 MHz showed signs of life on the evening of the 10th; VE1UT in Nova Scotia was making noise and made a 1296 MHz QSO into the Asbury Park NJ area. There may have been more DX than that but I don't have any reports.

The June VHF QSO Party had excellent propagation too. Once again the Caribbean to the west. Many missed two rare grids; one was WA2GEZ/MM in FM39 and KA1ICR/VE1 in FN85. On Sunday evening, the 15th, OX3LX worked several stations in the northeast; K1TOL & KA1PE, both in Maine, were two of the several.

From the Philly area 220 & 432 were good from Maine to West Virginia (W3CCX) with a few VE3s in there but activity was low because of good stuff flying around on 6 & 2 meters.

W6JKV/CT2 (Azores) will be on 6 meters for three weeks starting from June 19th or 20th, so if you have nt caught him yet there should be about another 10 days left after you get CHEESE-BITS. The beacon in Malta should be on by late July on 50.085 MHz.

Don't forget to listen for the U.K., Ireland, Norway and CT1WW. So far every opening to the U.K. has taken place in July. For indications of an Es opening to Europe listen for the BBC harmonic on 28.230 MHz, GB3SIX (1073TJ) on 50.019 and GB3NHQ (1091VQ) on 50.050 MHz. For the Grid hunters; N4VA will be in FM25 on 6 & 2 meters from July 6 - 12th. Have fun everyone!

MAY VHF/UHF ACTIVITY REPORT by Rick Connor, WB2NPE

Excellent spring conditions continued during the month of May throughout the VHF/UHF bands indicating that we may be in for a season of fun on the radio. May 2 and 3 brought us some intense Aurora conditions providing communications from our area to VEI, VE2, VE3, W8, W9 for several hours. Buzzing signals were reported as high as 220 MHz and several new states and grids were worked by guys in our districts. The Aurora returned May 5, 6 with shorter duration (about 2 hours) and gave us a second apportunity for about the communications path. It would be interesting to check the records of our "Sun Watcher," W2AXU and find what A and K indecies were recorded. These are probably the best indicator of Aurora conditions approaching or past.

The 1296 MHz Sprint was run on May 8 with 40-plus stations to work from EPA, SNJ stations -- much better activity than last year. Conditions were nt super but good enough for a contact between N3CX and W3QIZ in FNØØ (near Pittsburgh). Other club members heard on the 23cm band Sprint were WA3NUF, WA3JUF, AK3O, N3AOG, and WB3JYO.

On Saturday morning, May 10, 2-Meters opened with a wild Sporadic-E path out to the West and South. Stations from our area worked into western Texas, Louisiana, Alabama, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Florida, Kansas, Arkansas, and Missouri. These areas were all involved in heavy thunderstorm activity at the time which supports the connection between Es and electrical storms. The six meter band had been strong with Es several hours before the opening on 2. Just before 2 meters began to open, 6-meter propagation began to shorten (much like the 10 meter band does preceding 6-meter openings). Watch for the short skip on 6 during intense sporadic E. We've already had a second E-skip opening this month on 2-meters.

The 6-meter sprint came on May 17th following a day of great 50 Mhz skip conditions. See KS2T report for details.

Nightly tropo on 2-1296 for the month as been generally good with 9's and 8's in at 0100-0300Z nightly and 8's in on 220 and 432 around 0200-0300Z. I've had good success working/hearing WA3TTS, EN90 on 1296 near our sunset and near midnight local time. Mike is running about 80 watts and pair of F9FT yagis.

Keep an ear in the headphones -- see you next month.

FROM ARRL LETTER

HAVING TROUBLE WITH LOCAL ZONING/TOWER HEIGHT ORDINANCES? - ARRL HQ has put together a "PRB-1" package which consists of a copy of PRB-1, model antenna ordinances, general information about Amateur Radio, names and addresses of local ARRL volunteer Counsels and other information useful in the battle against unduly restrictive antenna ordinances. For a copy, send \$3.00 (for postage) to HQ requesting the PRB-1 package.

AMATEUR LICENSE RENEWAL AND GRACE PERIOD - HQ has received a number of inquiries about renewing an amateur license and its grace period. If you have a license good for a five year term, its grace period, should you fail to renew, is five years. After two years of the grace period has elapsed, you will lose your call-sign and will be assigned a new one. (Note that the new 10-year term licenses, which have been issued since January 1984, have a 2-year grace period.) To renew an amateur license, use FCC Form 610, which is available from FCC or ARRL HQ. There is NO fee for renewing an amateur license.

THE FIRST MULTIBAND MICROWAVE BEACON COMES ONLINE FROM NORTH CAROLINA MOUNTAINS AT 4777 AMSL IN EM85md

One reason I've almost dropped out of sight in the past six months has been a very important project for microwave activity in the southeast. On June 1st 1986 I placed into operation the first known multiband phase locked beacon in the US. The beacon is capable of operation on the following frequencies:

432.0715 MHz 1 Watt EIRP OMNI
1296.2145 MHZ 2 Watts EIRP OMNI
2304.3575 MHz 100 mw EIRP beamed SW
3456.572 MHz not operational, plan 10mw to 4° dish
5760.9295 MHz 8 Watts EIRP beamed SW
10,369.716 MHz not operational, plan .4W EIRP beam SW

All beacons are CW (Al) identified " de K4MSK/BCN EM85md EM85md "

The beacons are phase-locked to a 108.01788 MHz ovenized crystal oscillator. Drift will be +/- 3ppm 0-60 degrees C and per year. We will touch up the tuning as necessary to maintain a frequency near 432.0715 MHz as the prime frequency. Since I do an unequal power division and then triple to get the 1296 beacon, all one has to do id transmit on the 432 beacon's frequency zero beat and look for your third harmonic on 1296. The beacon will be exactly on frequency. This allows you to precisely locate where it should be even if its below your noise floor at that particular time. This should cut down on the tuning and allow CW filters to be more effectively used to "dig" for the signals in a narrowed "search zone".

I have the 10 GHz phased locked loop working but ocassionally it would lose lock so I did'nt take it up on the mountain with the initial system installation. 3456 MHz did not get hooked up because the antenna wasn't ready. Other planned improvements are more power for 2304 and 3456, at which time I may go omnidirectional if I can get a strong enough signal into Atlanta on a frequent basis.

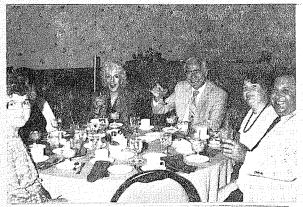
 $9\emptyset2$ MHz is also a possibility as I could readily add a $76\emptyset$ MHz synthesized LO that I have. By mixing this with the 144 MHz keyed signal (used on $576\emptyset$ and $23\emptyset4$ parts of the beacon) I would come out exactly at $9\emptyset4.00\emptyset$. I have plenty of ways to get power on that frequency so expect it to be added to the contingent of beacons at some point later this year.

We didn't forget 220 either. The Fourland VHF Contest group placed a wide coverage repeater on 224.72 MHz. The closest one on that frequency is Falls Church Virginia near Washington DC so we run 65 watts to a 9 dB gain antenna, GaAsFET preamp, etc. This gives mobile coverage from Atlanta to Charlotte and West to Oak Ridge TN. The repeater is of course atop 4777' Mt. Toxaway also. In fact the beacon is sitting right atop the repeater's rack.

No beacon is necessary on 144 as K4MSK himself performs that function nicely with four KLM 144-16LBXs and the Henry 8877 Amp. On the worst day John can hit Washington DC to Orlando to Indiana to New Orleans. When conditions are good, lookout.
