#### SPRINT CONTEST INFORMATION

Entries for each contest must be postmarked by June 20. Contests are separate. Mail contest entries in separate envelopes. Submit separate log and summary sheets for each contest entered. Logs must indicate time, call sign and complete exchange for each valid QSO. Include dupe sheets with entries of more than 100 QSO's. Use the official entry forms available from ARRL Headquarters for a S.A.S.E.

## FROM ARRL LETTER AMATEUR RADIO FROM SPACE THIS SUMMER

Ham-in-Space planners announce that à frequency of 145.55 MHz will be the primary down-link for the amateur station of Shuttle Flight 51 F. Verbal word from NASA/Houston still sets the launch for July 15th, with the first amateur operations coming as early as the second half of day two. Early transmissions from Tony England, WØORE are likely to be slow-scan television rather than 2-way voice. After day three, chances improve for regular contacts.

The limited opportunity for two way contacts will be used to fulfill Tony's primary interest: working youth groups paired with ham clubs. Local Amateur Radio clubs meeting certain guidelines will be able to get a list of special, non-published uplink frequencies to be used for this purpose. Application forms are now available for qualified groups. Requests should be sent to ARRL Hq. in Newington, attention: Ham-in-Space Mission.

At least three shuttle astronauts are expressing an interest in operating the ham station that will be part of flight 51-F. Tony England, WOORE, is still considered the prime operator. Fellow astronaut John David Bartoe, W4NYZ, is also expected to take the microphone for two-way contacts with earth-bound amateurs. Shuttle commander Gordon Fullerton, who used to be a Novice, may also revive his interest in ham radio. All amateur operations will come under Tony's call as we now understand it.

NASA officials say it is important to point out that flight 51-F remains a SPACELAB mission and not an Amateur Radio mission. Shuttle duties always have first priority.

A hectic shuttle workload makes advance scheduling of contacts impossible, so NASA planners are agreeing to announce the status of the amateur station one pass ahead of time. NASA ham clubs will help distribute the information as part of the long-successful effort to retransmit shuttle communications with ground controllers. WIAW and possible dedicated telephone numbers will be additional sources of information.

FROM NE VHF NEWS

THE FIRST CQ WORLD-WIDE VHF WPX CONTEST: February, 1985 CQ Magazine has the details of this new contest, to be held from 0000Z July 20, 1985 to 2400Z July 21, 1985. All authorized Amateur bands from 6 meters through 23 cm are permitted. All authorized modes are permitted, with the exception of repeater contacts, including via satellites. The exchange is a consecutive serial number and callsign. The multiplier is the number of prefixes worked per band, and QSOs count one point on 50, 70 and 144 MHz; two points per QSO on 220 MHz; and four points per QSO on 1296 MHz. The final score is the number of QSO points times the sum of band multipliers. The classes of entry are numerous: Single operator, single band; single operator, multi-band; single operator, single band; low power; single operator, multi-band, low power; multi-operator, single band; multi-operator, multi-band; portable; and FM only. Low power is defined as 25 watts PEP output or less. A commemorative certificate will be

awarded to every first-year entrant. Trophies will be awarded to the national top-scoring station in each category, as well as certificates for the top score in each call area. It

The February, 1985 issue begins Jack's second year of publication. The subscription rate is now \$5.00 per year.

1985 CENTRAL STATES VHF SOCIETY CONFERENCE: The 1985 CSVHF Conference will be held in Tulsa, OK the weekend of July 26, 28, 1985 at the Sheraton Inn Skyline East, 6333 East Skelly Drive. The hotel is just off I-44 within 10 minutes of the Tulsa International Airport. Reservation information will be mailed to CSVHF Society members in early June; contact WORRY or WOOHU if you aren't a member. (TNX WD4MBK)

EAST COAST 70 CM NET: The East Coast 70cm Net continues to meet from 9 to 11 PM Eastern time on Wednesday evenings on 432.090 MHz. This net has been in operation for 5 1/2 years, with NCS duties being shared between K4CAW and WA4ZIA. Typically, 30 to 40 stations check in from 10 or more states. It seems that most of the 3rd and 4th call areas are within reliable range of the NCS stations. (TNX WD4MBK)

VUCC AWARDS FOR MICROWAVE BANDS: Effective immediately, the ARRL will accept applications for the VUCC Award for the microwave frequencies. Individual band awards are now available with the minimum number of grid squares to qualify as follows: 2.3 GHz, 10 squares; 3.4 GHz, 5 squares; 5.7 GHz, 5 squares; 10 GHz, 5 squares. Contacts are good retroactively to January 1, 1983. Endorsements are in increments of 5 squares. Contacts must be made from a single location, defined as within a 300 meter diameter circle. The first three qualifiers on each band will receive their certificates mounted on walnut plaques. Application information and the name of the closest awards manager is available from ARRL Headquarters for an SASE.


