Using 'N' connectors on 1/2" hardline




I have used standard 'N' fittings on 1/2" aluminum hardline for the past 10 years. Performance and weatherability is as good or better than commercially made connectors. Most commercial connectors have a push fit center conductor connection that turns green after six months outside.

This procedure allows the use of ordinary 'N' connectors to be used on 1/2" aluminum hardline with the solid copper center conductor.


- 1. Strip off the plastic covering (do not nick aluminum)
- 2. Bore the nut to 1/2"
- 3. Slide the nut on the cable
- 4. Slide the furrel on (file to fit the inside of connector)
- # 5. Bend down 21/8" of aluminum to form a clamping ring inside the housing
 - 6. Cut the center conductor flush
 - 7. Drill a hole in the center conductor for # 18 tinned wire
 - 8. Solder center pin and wire to center conductor
 - 9. Assemble the connector. After tightening the nut, the connector housing should not turn. If loose or nut bottoms out, increase the width of the furrel.
 - 10. Use Oxiban or other oxide inhibitant at the furrel to aluminum connection
 - 11. Use GE RTV on all connectors outside. Tape is not needed

Furrel is 0.2" wide piece of 1/2" soft copper pipe with a piece taken out to fit snug around alum. jacket





PACK RAT 2.3 GHZ GRID EXPEDITION (FN10, FM18, FM19, FM28, FN30, FN 31)

After getting operational on 2.3 ghz in the fall of '84 and noting the interest in the band during the January '85 contest, I decided to try and get a 2.3 ghz expedition together. I wanted to see if it would be possible to get the VUCC award for some members of the Pack Rats (WA3AXV and WA3JUF). I discussed this with Ron, WA3AXV and Dave, WA3JUF and we chose the weekend of the June contest for the start, mainly because of the activity level on the band from some of the big multiops in needed grid squares. Dick, N3AOG and Pat, WB3DNI said they would lend a helping hand and Dick said he would take his RV for a base. Everything was set and Ron and Dave said their gear was ready and peaked. After a small meeting of the minds, we decided to take 2 meter ssb for liaison back home and 23 cm for initial microwave antenna alignment. On 2 meter we had 40 watts and a small boomer and on 2304 we had about 6 watts out and two 45 element loopers at about 25%. All antennas were on the same mast. Friday, June 7th rolled around and it was raining like cats and dogs when we arrived at the site in MD. (Tuckahoe State Park). Tuckahoe is very close to where all four grids come together (FM19, FM18, FM28, FM29). The Park Ranger was nice enough to let us in the park after seeing Dick, N3AOG backing his RV around looking for a place to sit till morning. We explained to the ranger what we were trying to do and he took us to an open spot in the park. After some signal tests on 1296, we decided to move location. Next morning we went to the Delaware coast, Cape Henlopen (FM28). Signals coming off Delaware Bay were unbelievable, 2 meters - 59, 1296 - 59/599, 2304 WA3AXV was 559 to 579, WA3JUF was 539 to 569. That completed grid FM28. After packing the gear into Dick's RV, we decided to go south to Annapolis. We picked a location on Chesapeake Bay south of Annapolis, Curtis Point. We set up only a few yards from the shore line. All went well except Dave, WA3JUF had antenna relay problems. Ron, WA3AXV was still 559 to 579 on 13 cem. We realized having 2 mtrs and 1296 to establish contact was a good method to align the antennas. We stayed at Curtis Point for about 1 1/2 hours trying to get Dave, WA3JUF on 2304 but no luck. That took care of FM 18 and we were off to Pa.

We were exhausted from all the driving and erecting and dismantling. Dick, N3AOG and Pat, WB3DNI did an outstanding job during the entire expedition. I appreciated their enthusiasm, they're real Pack Rats.

Saturday night we drove to a State Park northeast of Baltimore. We slept for a few hours and then decided to go to the Northwest corner of FM19. We were in Gap, Pa. for FM19 and moved down the road to Vintage, Pa. for FN10. By 2 PM, Sunday afternoon, we had accomplished most of what we had set out to do except Dave, WA3JUF on 2304 down in FM18.

On June 16th, (Father's Day) Dick, N3AOG and myself headed for Long Branch, N.J. FN3O. We set up in Sea Bright right on the coast. All signals were good again but Dave was very weak 339 on 13 cm. Ron, WA3AXV was still strong on 2304, 559 and 579. From all locations signals were good on 1296. Dick and I discussed FN31 with Ron, WA3AXV and Dave, WA3JUF while we were driving to Conn. on 75 meters. We decided to go to Greenwich Point, Ct. When we arrived at Greenwich Point we discovered that only residents of Greenwich were allowed in the Park, We explained to the police and park officials why we were there and after checking with headquarters we were escorted to a nice location on the tip of Greenwich Point. We set up about 15 feet from the water's edge and made 2 mtr. contact, then went to 1296. Signals on 1296 were fantastic, 59 very rapid QSB. We went to 2304 and made contact with Ron, WA3AXV and his signals were 549 and 569. Dick and I wondered if we would hear Dave's signals. We made contact with Dave, WA3JUF on 1296 and adjusted the antennas right on him, went to 2304 and there he was 559 and 579. We even talked on sideband. Dick and I were very excited.

We checked with Ron, WA3AXV he had 11 grids not all confirmed, and Dave, WA3JUF had 10 grids not all confirmed.

Distance from WA3AXV and WA3JUF home stations to grids: FM28 - 105 miles, FM-18 125 miles; FN10 and FN19 approx. 45 miles. FM31 95 miles and FM30- 75 miles.


