NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS By Lyn, W3NSI

- 1. ICOM IC 27A 2 METER T/R: The new IC27A claims to be the most compact of the mobile 2 meter FM rigs. It is a MM or so smaller than the Kenwood TM 201 and the Kenwood uses an external speaker. In any case it is rather easy to find space under the dash for a radio 5 1/2 by 1 1/2 inches. The 27 runs 25 watts out and comes with a TT pad type mic. Other features include 32 PL tones built in, 10 memories with battery back-up, scanning and digital readout. One option of interest is a speech synthesizer that at the push of a button will announce the received frequency. The idea here is to keep your eyes on the road. A model 37A for 220 MHz is in the pipeline and may be available as you read this. Price \$369.
- 2. DAIWA ANTENNA TUNERS: There seem to be hundreds of antenna tuners on the market for use with both HF and VHF rigs. However, there are several Daiwa units that are of some interest due to both their compact size and band coverage. The CNW 817 covers the 21 and 28 MHz bands only. The CNW 818 covers 21, 24, 28, and 50 MHz. The CNW 917 covers both 50 and 144 Mhz. All models have built in power meters with 20 and 100 watt ranges using a dual needle meter. All units are 6 1/2 w 3 h and 4 d. Price \$135 class
- 3. FM BROADCASTER: Several months back, a device called a Widget was written up in this paper. That unit operated on 530 Khz crystal controlled. S&T Electronics has a VHF unit that is built even more compactly. The parts for this crystal controlled VHF unit are wired into a PL55 phone plug. This plug is inserted in the phone jack, or speaker jack of a shortwave receiver or any other receiver section of a transceiver. A whip antenna plugs into the pl55 plug unit and the VHF signal is then received at the remote point on your HT. Range is about 100 feet using the UL2M and an HT. Price \$20. 1401 Rae Ln., Madison, WI.53711

Update on NCG Tri-Bander: This rig which will become available in March covers 21-7-50 Mhz and features a built in P.S. for AC and can be operated from 13.8 VDC for mobile work. Size is 9 1/2w 10 1/2d and 4h, a bigger radio than was expected. The T/R covers all of the 7 and 21 MHz bands and first 500 Khz on 50 Mhz. Other features are 4 digit readout, 10 watts power out and SSB or CW operation. Rig is manufactured by Matsushita. Price \$435 list.

VHF/UHF REPORT By Joe, W2EIF

The VHF/UHF bands have been quiet since the contest. Normal activity prevails, which is low. This time of year usually presents the poorest propagation conditions, leaving little except for Moonbounce and occasional Es openings on six.

Six meters has had a few Es openings and Sunday Feb. 12 produced a good aurora session on the bands plus some tropo on six.

I haven't seen any announcements of Spring Sprints for 1984. Wonder if we are going to have them this year. As I recall, the New England group didn't seem to be very active in the 1983 Fall Sprints. Hope they turn it around.

1296 seems to be doing quite well with quite a few on Monday Nites and during the Pack-Rat Net. SSB is the mode now prevalent on that band as it is on the lower bands. The availability of SSB transverters seems to have paid off. Still repairing rigs as a result of contest activity so can't monitor as much as I would like.

PRELIMINARY REPORT -SPRUCE KNOB W. VA. EXPEDITION AUGUST 1984 UHF CONTEST By Bill Olson, W3HQT

The Club has tentatively decided to operate the August UHF Contest from Spruce Knob, a mountain in East Central West Virginia. The advantages of operating from Spruce Knob Are:

- 1. Height 4600 ft., highest point in W. Va. and highest within a couple hundred miles radius.
- 2. Geographical Location the following cities are within 500 miles (UHF mountain-top range): Chicago; Milwaukee; Boston; Nashville, Atlanta; Charleston, S.C.; Ottawa; you get the picture.
 - 3. Accessibility Road to top and less than 300 miles from Philadelphia,
- 4. Dxpedition Possibilities Since Spruce Knob is near one corner of FMO8 and the highest point in a very mountainous area, microwave line of sight paths should be possible.

Spruce Knob has been used many times as a VHF contest site and the local U.S. Forest Service office apparently has no problem granting permission. There is no power so we will have to bring generators, but there is a paved parking area and the trees on top are 10 ft. tall max. We will need a lot of help to pull this one off, but this is potentially the best VHF location in the East! Here's a few preliminary thoughts.

- A. Need volunteers for equipment and operating.
- B. Generators enough for 2 kws plus microwave.
- C. Volunteers for dxpedition operators 1296, 2304, 3455, NGC
- D. Need skeds coordinator we will have to schedule the World this is a must.
- E. 220 FM will be worth a lot of otherwise non-active grids need big antennas, kw on 223.5.
- F. Need trucks, campers, food volunteers etc., etc.

Spruce Knob is a bit off the beaten path, but it is such an excellent location we should be able to work everything in the Ohio, Pa., Va., Md., W. Va., N.C., areas and the big guns out to Me., Wisc., Fla., Que. This means a good bunch of QSO's and probably more grids than can be worked (without EME) from any other location in the country.
