

NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS

- 1. SSB/CW 2 AND 6 M MINI-TRANSCEIVER KITS: ACE Communications, Inc. is advertising a pair of VHF QRP rigs available as Semi-kits in knock-down form for easy assembly. The MX6Z and MX2 cover 50 KHz on each of two channels available on these tiny VXO controlled radios. Output is .2-.25 watt from the transmitter section. The receiver is a single conversion unit using a crystal filter at 7.8 MHz. Either set is about the size of a pack of king size cigarettes. Power is supplied by 6 AAA cells or a 9 volt battery. It is necessary to solder a few wires to switches and connectors and mount the sub-assemblies into the case. Price \$130. 2832 D. Walnut Avenue, Tustin, California 92680
- 2. TRANSMITTING POWER AMPLIFIER FOR 1296 MHZ: The VHF Shop in Mountaintop, Pa. is selling two types of 1296 tube type amps. The single tube version uses a 7289 tube and is rated at 60 watts out with 10 watts drive. The two tube unit is rated at 120 watts with 10 watts input. FROM ARRL LETTER 2/17/83

Today General Manager Summer announced the appointment of Paul Rinaldo, W4RI, to succeed Doug DeMaw, W1FB, as ARRL Technical Department Manager upon Doug's retirement. Rinaldo, who currently edits QEX and serves as President of AMRAD, owns a consulting firm in Washington area. Paul and his family will be relocating to the Newington area in early May.

Summer praised the work Rinaldo has done with <u>QEX</u> since its inception, and his work as a volunteer in promoting Amateur Radio technical development. He noted that Rinaldo has been particularly active in the development of packet radio and spread sprectrum techniques for use by U.S. amateurs. Summer said that Rinaldo had demonstrated leadership qualities that made him the logical choice to lead ARRL in the new electronic age dominated by computer technology.

All out effort - WA2DPU was really pushing! Activity was good on 1296 but poor conditions to the North (snow) produced little long haul to New York and New England.


New format is really good for the Jan SS; the only drawback is not knowing how the competition is doing. Please no grid squares for this contest (the reduced book-keeping was a welcome relief.

The dropping of the serial NR not particularly earth shaking — feel that we should restore the NR as distinctive to the Jan Contest. The only ones it helped probably were the scatter ops (they already knew the section and only needed the sig report). Sig reports are easier to read as opposed to unknown NRs. Have heard rumors of changes to incorporate grid squares instead of sections. In my opinion this would be a mistake in any of the big three tests — namely JAN., JUNE and SEPT. test. (Would not mind it in UHF Test or Aurora contacts).

Any one who ever worked one of the "ZipCode" contests and had any large NR of contacts was faced with a monumental calculation task sincé almost every contact was a muliplier. I know, I tried it once! In my opinion, the additional effort would more than double the time it now takes to properly compute a final score and would certainly contribute to less contact activity. Finally, if you want to experiment - try it first in the November Sweepstakes instead of VHF and start a






