- 1. FM Adaptor for use with Gonset Communicator. This plug in modulator puts the transmitter section of any Gonset Communicator on FM. No modification or rewiring is necessary. Just plug one cable into mic jack, the other into crystal socket. Unit is only 4" x 3" x 1 1/2" and power comes from a 9 volt battery inside the case. - 2. SSB Transmitter/Receiver unit. The Hallicrafters company will soon introduce a self contained SSB/CW transceiver, the FPM 300. All solid state except for PA tubes, the new T/R, with a built in AC/DC power supply, weighs 25 pounds, and is more compact than any past Hallicrafter T/R in this power class. "1296 DXpedition to Delaware"

The 1296 DXpedition to Delaware has been postponed. Two locations in northern Delaware had been scouted. Permission to operate at one (a fire tower) had been obtained. Permission to operate at the second (a tall new building) was highly probable. Two weeks before the Dypedition the person in charge of the fire tower became sick and was hospitalized. He was unable therefore to assume responsibility for our project. The Board of Directors of the Corporation that owns the tall building decided that since the building was still under construction, they could not give us permission to operate there. However, they said that we would be welcome after the building is finished in late summer. The Dxpedition has been tentatively scheduled for late September or early October. All those who were readying equipment to try to work the Delaware expedition are invited to check out their gear by working W3CCX/3 on 1296 MHz during the June Contest. w3CCX/3will be operating from Hilltown, Pa. on the 10th and 11th of June, 1972.

VHF REPORT JO,W2EIF

The two meter band has maintained its activity throughout the past year, particularly at the low frequency end of the band. Activity North of New York City has dropped off. Boston area stations are usually heard on nets but not otherwise. This type of "once a week activity" does not keep a band active. There was an aurora on Monday, May 15, 1972, from 6:00 p.m. to after 11:00 p.m. Results were good on 2 meters with stations in Wisconsin, Ill, VE2 and Maine being heard and worked.

The six meter band has been opening lately starting the 1st week in May. Oregon, Arizona and New Mexico have been heard and worked as well as many on the 400 to 1200 mile range. The aurora on May 15th produced a lot of contacts on those hard to work close in areas.

The 220 MHz band is low in activity but have worked KlPXE in Connecticut quite often. VE3DSS in Toronto has high power on 220 and was heard by W2EIF, 5X3X9. Unfortunately, W2EIF was running low power CW at the time and although heard by VE3DSS, the signal was not strong enough to make a QSO. 432 MHz seems to be going as normal. W2AZL reports that K8RPL in Ohio is coming through on CW quite often. I do not operate 1296 MHz but there is some info on activity to the West. W8DGF in Cleveland has worked W8Y10 in Michigan (150 miles) with 8 watts. This was his driver, the final (100 watts) was not working at the time. It is also reported that W3RUE in Western Pennsylvania as also on 1296 MHz using low power.

Amateur Radio is not what it used to be - at least in the eyes of other users of the radio spectrum. It should not come as a surprise, then, that occasionally other services eye the amateur bands with a view toward confiscation. It must be admitted that activity on some bands, although increasing, is not as great as could be desired to make a good case for our continuing use of these bands. A good example is the 220 MHz or 1 1/4 meter band. Activity on two meters and on 432 MHz is much higher than on this band.

And so, we have a proposal before the FCC by the Citizen's Radio Section of the EIA to convert part of 220 into a Class E Citizens Radio Service. Eighty FM channels would be provided, presumably to be used by the same mixture of legitimate business services and ragchewing teenagers as the present class D.

Having lost one Ham band to CB'ers do we now want to lose part of another? It is time for all VHF amateurs who are worthy of the name to get on 220 MHz, to prove that we really do use the band. More important, everyone who cares should write to the FCC (The Chief of the FCC Amateur/Citizens Radio Division has recommended that all comments on the EIA proposal be



TECHNIGRAM

Have been fooling around with a bunch of diodes, trying to separate the good from the bad. Finally came up with a scheme which works quite well, and which gives the voltage capability of the diode and in addition will form and voltage rate electrolyte condensers. There is a diagram enclosed.



The series resistor limits the current to 1 MA, so even 10 volt diodes or capacitors may be tested without damage. Electrolytics are formed very gradually and voltage-tested at the same time. The meter "V" is any voltmeter, or VOM.

Diodes should be connected to the test terminals with the diode cathode to circuit "positive"; capacitors are connected plus to plus.


(1) Atlantic Div. Director, W3SW, adressing members. (2) Our Prez, W3CJU,
