This year we have not one, but two winners, John T. Chambers, WANEZ, of Palos Verdes Estates, Near Los Angles, Cal., and Ralph E. Thomas, KM6UK, of Dahu, Hawaii, for their communication distance record of 2,540 miles on 432 Mg, on July 20, 1960.

This and similar feats confirmed a theory that UHF radio communications was not limited principally to lineof-sight or very short range.

The winning pair have set other records in the UHF frequency ranges on the same 2,540-mile course between Hawaii and California: one on 144 Mc. in July, 1957, and another on 220 Mc in June, 1959.
